Visit Surry County, Virginia, and see the future taking shape before your eyes. Tomorrow is happening today in this wooded setting in the heart of history-land. Today the sounds are those of construction vehicles—tomorrow will bring the steady quiet of nuclear generated electricity expanding the progress of Vepco's 32,000 square mile service area.

What's happening? The Surry Power Station — Virginia's first commercial nuclear station. This giant complex will consist of two units to be completed in 1971 and 1972. These units will generate 1,626,000 kilowatts of electricity—enough power to serve approximately 400,000 households.

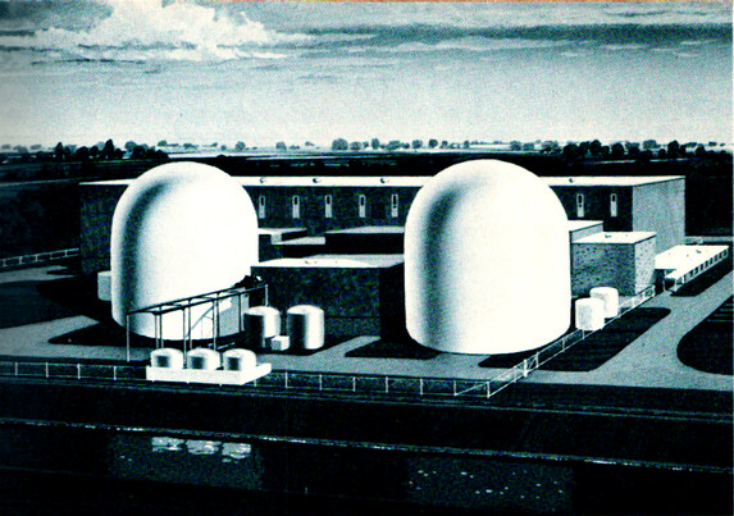
You can see it all taking shape at Vepco's Nuclear Information Center, a few hundred feet from the plant itself.

This ultra-modern center has displays designed by some of the nation's top exhibit builders. When you enter this slice of tomorrow, you are transported by color, light and motion through the fantastic world of nuclear energy. Working models, animated displays, teaching machines—all make your visit to the Center extremely enjoyable as well as informative. Slides, lectures, and movies add thought-provoking commentary on the exciting power of the atom.

While at the Center, you will have the opportunity to watch the construction of the power station from an elevated observation deck. You can be a sidewalk superintendent for one of the most exciting construction projects in Virginia.

Visit Surry today . . . and look at tomorrow.





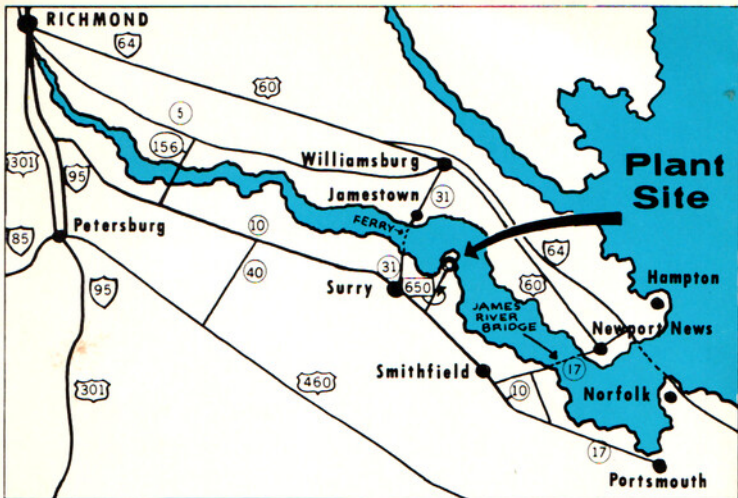
An artist's rendering of Virginia's first commercial nuclear power station as it will appear when completed in 1972.

directions . . . From Richmond area: take Interstate 95 South to Route 10. Follow Route 10 through the town of Surry. At Route 650 turn left and follow the signs to the Surry Nuclear Information Center. **From Norfolk area:** take Route 17 North to Route 258 and then to Route 10. Follow Route 10 and turn right onto Route 650 and follow the signs. **From Williamsburg area:** take Route 31 to Jamestown and take the ferry across the river and follow the signs.
